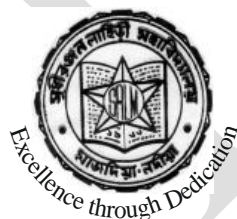

**Major Activities of NSS Volunteers during year:**

01 volunteer participated in RD Camp in New Delhi, 06 in State R D Camp in Kolkata, 02 in Adventure Camp in Manali, 04 in National Youth Festival in Rohtak and 05 in National Integration Camp in Bankura. Our Volunteers participated in the Digital India Workshop held in the University and secured 1<sup>st</sup> position in the Idea Generation Competition.

In **NORMAL ACTIVITIES** it has organised 04 seminars on “**Rhythmic Yoga**”, “**Thalassaemia**”, “**Swamiji and Youth Leadership**”, “**Bhasa Dibas**” and “**Need of Counseling**”; observed National Communal Harmony Week by Skit Show, Placard Competition, Rally, Seminar on “**Communal Harmony and National Integration**”; taken part in Polio Immunisation Programme and Japanese Encephalitis Vaccination Programme, and organised two Blood Donation Camps, one Thalassaemia Screening Camp and a Blood Group Detection Camp. The unit has picked up 05 road-side display boards containing messages on **Swachh Bharat, Anti-Ragging, AIDS, Thalassaemia, Water Conservation and Use of Herbs**; conducted a 6-day ‘**Course on Happiness**’ in association with Art of Living

In the **SPECIAL CAMP** it has made an asset in terms of a **Brick Path** measuring 8.5 feet x 3.5 feet connecting our Herbal Garden; organized 04 seminars on “**Gandhiji, Swachhta & Swaraj**” “**First Aid**” “**Say No To Alcohol**” “**Cashless Transactions**” and volunteers organised Plantation Programme, health survey and health counseling in adopted village and conducted hand wash drive to the pupils of a Primary School in the adopted village; conducted Swachhta Abhiyan at Majdia Rail Station and poster competition on “**Safe Drive Save Life**” and a rally with the posters; volunteers have painted Wall Graffiti on “**Female Foeticide**”, “**Say No To Drug**” and “**Yoga For Peace & Harmony**”.

**Our opportunities:**


- Most of the students can fair well in all types of activities despite their socio-economic backwardness.

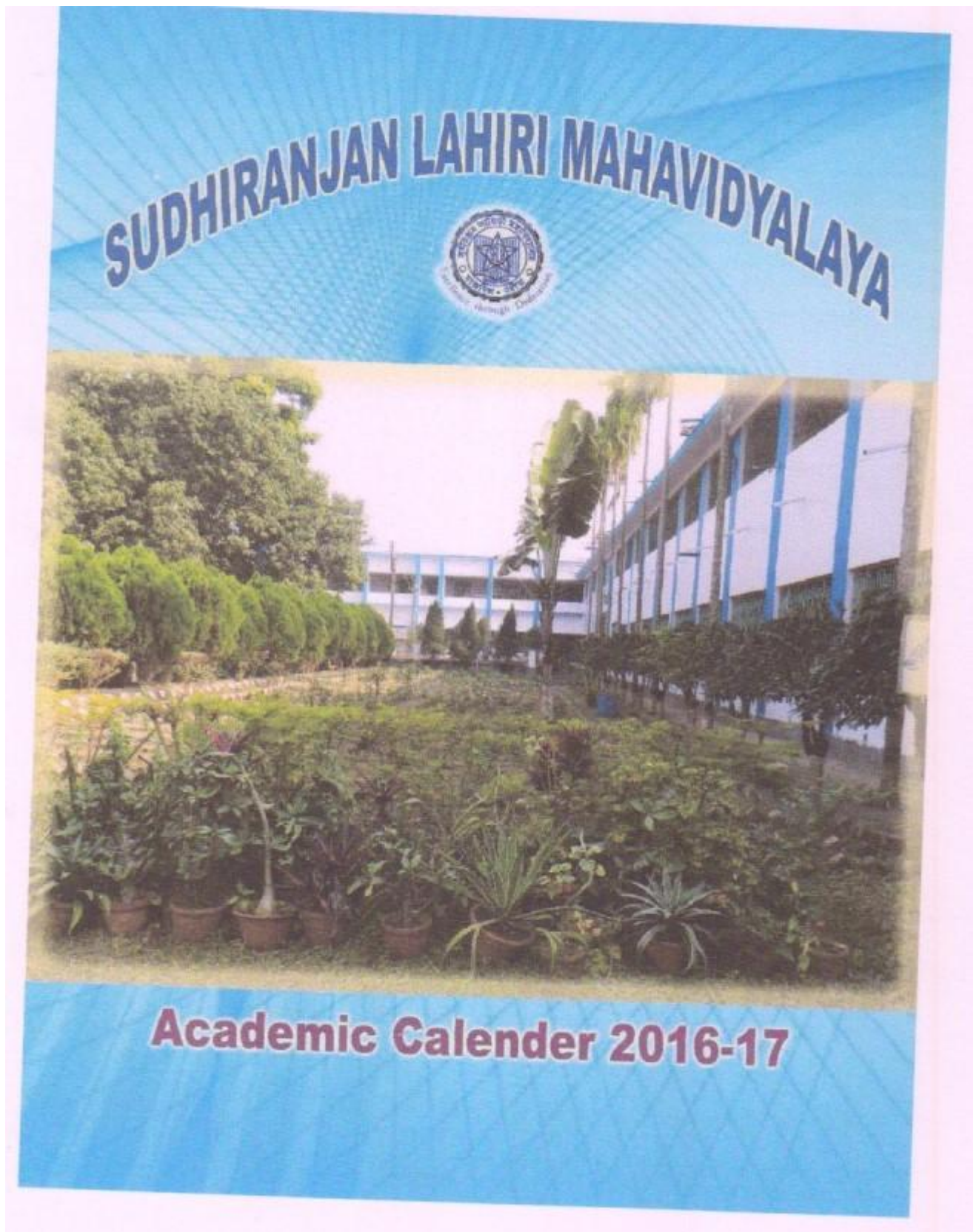

### *Annexure-III*

#### **Details of Management Information System**

##### **Administrative procedures including finance:**

In the matter of administration the Governing Body of the College is the supreme authority. It formulates its administrative plans and programmes on the basis of recommendation of different sub-committees and rules, regulations, bye-laws framed time to time by the Government of West Bengal, University Grants Commission and the affiliating University i.e. University of Kalyani. At the interval of each period it evaluates whether those plans are properly implemented and finds out the problems in implementation of the same and adopts ways to overcome the situation.

In the matter of finance it prepares an annual budget of its income and expenditure on the basis of recommendation of the Finance Committee. The Finance Committee recommends the budget on the basis of past three years experience as well as rules, regulations, bye-laws framed time to time by the Government of West Bengal, University Grants Commission and the affiliating University i.e. University of Kalyani. At the interval of a particular period it reviews its budgeted actions and finds the way to overcome the situation.

##### **Student admission:**

In the matter of admission the Institution follows admission rules framed by the affiliating University. However internal rules and regulation regarding admission are recommended by the Teachers' Council following the guideline of the affiliating University.

##### **Student records:**

Student records of the College are maintained by using student software package. Generally student data are uploaded at cash counter where the students deposit their fees at the time of admission. Then those student data are disseminated to different segments like Academic Council, Teachers' Council, different academic departments and Internal Quality Assurance Cell

##### **Evaluation and examination procedures:**

Generally in the matter of evaluation and examination of the students of the College we follow the rules and regulations framed by the University. However it arranges Test Examination following the framework of University level of Examination for the students every year. Students, who qualify at the test examination are allowed for appearing at the University Examination and the students, who cannot are allowed at the consent of their guardian.

Further after publication of result of final University level Examination each of the academic departments evaluates the results of their students and presents the same to the College Governing Body through the Academic Council and recommends the name of the students, who are eligible for felicitation for their academic excellence and specific actions to be adopted for overcoming the challenges if any.

**Research administration:** Research activities of the College are generally conducted by the Seminar & Research Forum. The Seminar & Research Forum looks after the organization of Seminars by the different academic departments, research projects, conducted by the faculty members , participation and publication of the faculty members in different faculty development programmes.

**Others:**

Apart from above the College takes specific plans in various supporting activities like cultural programmes, games & sports , community extension programme, social action programmes based on science and environment through its various organs. At a specific interval it evaluates its performance in those activities and finds the ways to overcome the identified problems.

### **2. Goal**

The main objective of the institution is to transform the students into well meaning citizens through the committed pattern of instructions based on carefully prepared and well designed curricular aspects. The changing needs of the time are the basis while building a rich corpus of talent. Hence, the main objective of our college is to transform the students into good citizens through well prepared faculties and staff members. Sudhiranjan Lahiri Mahavidyalaya aspires to have a transformational impact on students through comprehensive education by inculcating qualities of competence, confidence and excellence. To achieve that goal it is necessary to ensure up to date renovation of all of our academic as well as administrative activities.

Nowadays civilization is going on too fast riding on technology. Information is available by a click of mouse. So we also have to go parallel with global development of technology. Everybody is responsible for optimal utilization of technology to serve the society better. But it is recognized fact that sufficient infrastructure to ensure academic activities with ICT enabled equipments are necessary pre condition for the same. Though previously we have introduced some ICT based classes out of fund provided by the UGC, but the same has been proved to be insufficient and not up to date to meet the purpose. That is why we have constructed one virtual class room at the aegis of the fund provided by the Government of West Bengal.

Sudhiranjan Lahiri Mahavidyalaya has become a pioneer institution in the state of West Bengal within a few couple of years from its inception in terms of teaching and learning, research and publication and co-curricular activities. Thus as a pioneer higher learning institution we can't deny the responsibility of ensuring adequate infrastructure to promote cultural activities of the students, which is an integral part of high education. Considering this ground level reality we renovate our open stage with all necessary amenities at the aegis of the fund provided under Rasthriya Uchhatara Siksha Abhiyan.

### **3. The Context:**

In the era of globalization the entire world has become a global village. As an important part of society we cannot avoid that trend prevailing throughout the World. Considering these realities use of modern technologies and equipments within the college campus for running academic as well as administrative activities is the need of the hour. Considering this ground level reality we constructed one virtual class with all types of ICT equipments.

Again, promotion of cultural activities of the students is the necessary preconditions for ensuring transformation our students into a good citizen. To achieve this goal it is necessary to ensure adequate infrastructure within the college premises. Though we previously constructed a open stage for organizing different cultural programme within campus, but with passage of time that has been become abandoned and not suitable to meet the purpose. So, we renovated the open stage and arranged all the other facilities along with the same.

#### **4. The Practice**

Time has come for us to adopt its modern technology-enabled equipments in academic as well as administrative activities of the institution. But the prevailing ICT based class room are not sufficient to conduct academic activities with all types of necessary ICT equipments. So, by constructing one virtual class room we have tried to do away the problem of existing ICT class rooms.

Again with the changes in time demand of the students for organizing cultural programmes within the campus is ever increasing. But the open stage, which we have constructed previously has been become abandoned. So by renovating the open stage we have done away the problem.

#### **5. Evidence of Success:**

The college is located at an economically and socially backward area. In spite of that fact it is committed to impart quality higher education to its students. In order to shoulder that responsibility it is use lot of modern technologies and equipments within the campus to conduct academic as well as administrative activities. Thus construction of virtual class room within the campus has ensured this goal.

Again it is not possible to ensure organization of different cultural activities within the campus without adequate infrastructure. By renovation of open stage with amenities we have ensured easiest solution of that problem.

#### **6. Problems encountered and Resources Required:**

Scarcity of adequate skilled staff, who are habituated with modern technology is a standing problem of the institution. With the help of very limited skilled staff we are striving for ensuring adequate maintenance of the virtual class room and its equipments.

Though we renovated our open stage and arranged all the amenities, but the same may not be proved to be sufficient to meet requirement due availability of adequate open space within the surrounding areas of the stage. Within the limited space we have tried our best to renovate our open stage and arrange all the other amenities to meet the demand of the students.

Major resources for two important activities have been financed by the Ministry of Higher Education , Government of West Bengal and Ministry of Human Resource Development , Government of India.
