DEPARTMENT OF SOCIOLOGY

Sudhiranjan Lahiri Mahavidyalaya has been teaching Sociology since the 1980s. The institution adopted the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 in July 2023, introducing reforms for undergraduate (UG) programs, including Sociology Courses. NEP 2020 emphasizes ongoing evaluation, curriculum flexibility, credit transfer and trans-disciplinary learning. The revised UG Sociology curriculum spans eight semesters, allowing students to study Major and Minor courses, as well as Multi-Disciplinary Courses. Each semester, lasting six months, includes internal tests and final university-level examinations, along with student presentations based on course curriculum and field findings.
